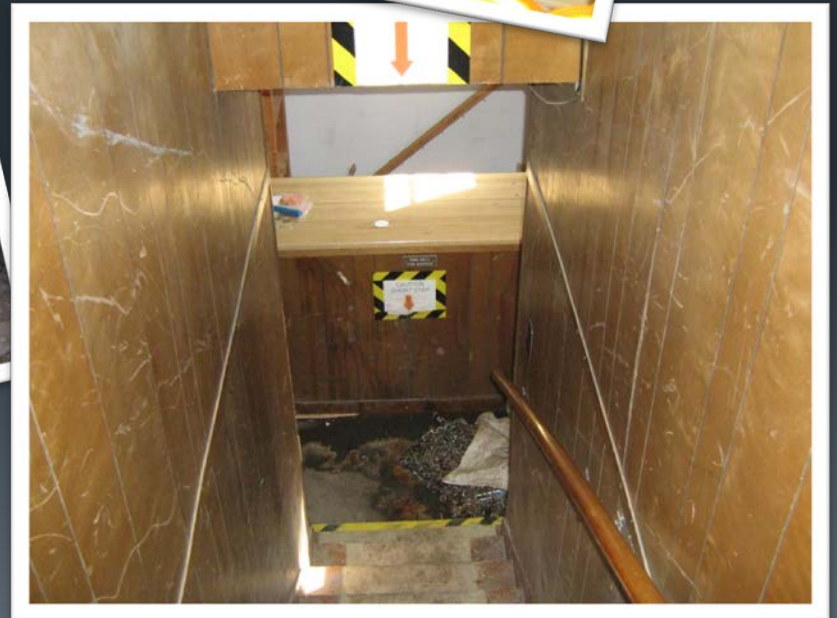
The City's new facility where all the essential vehicles, tools and equipment can now be stored together in one location to efficiently service the community.

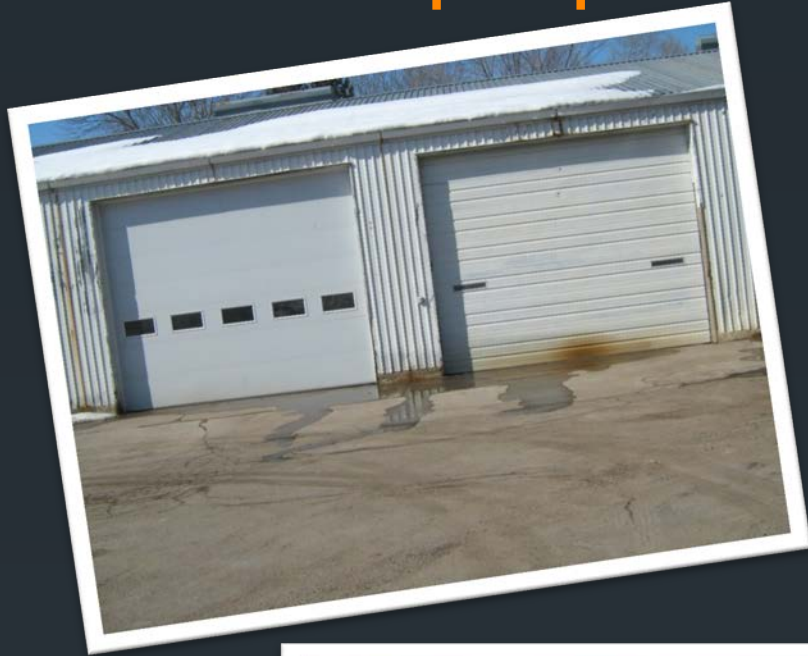

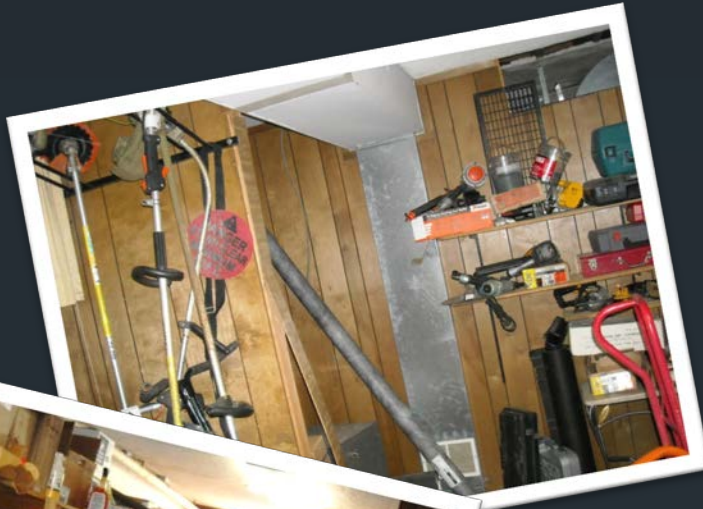

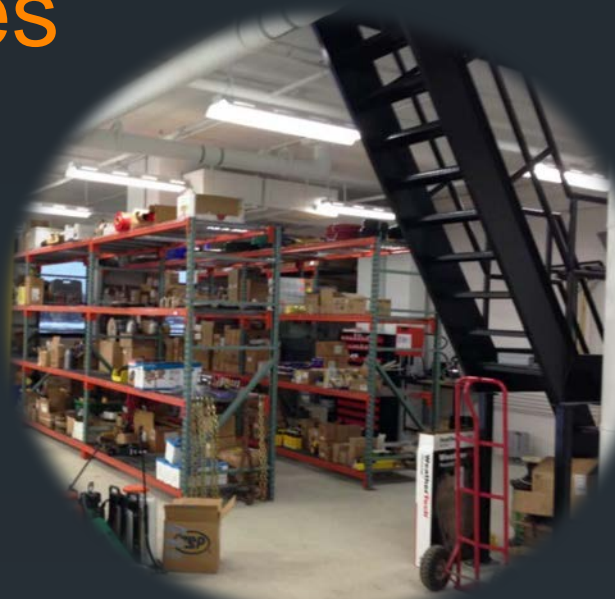

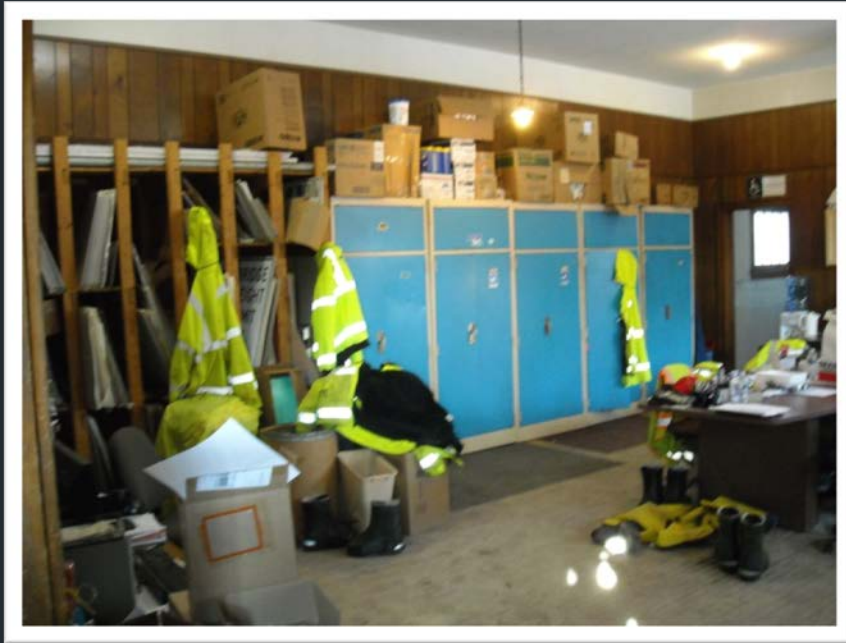

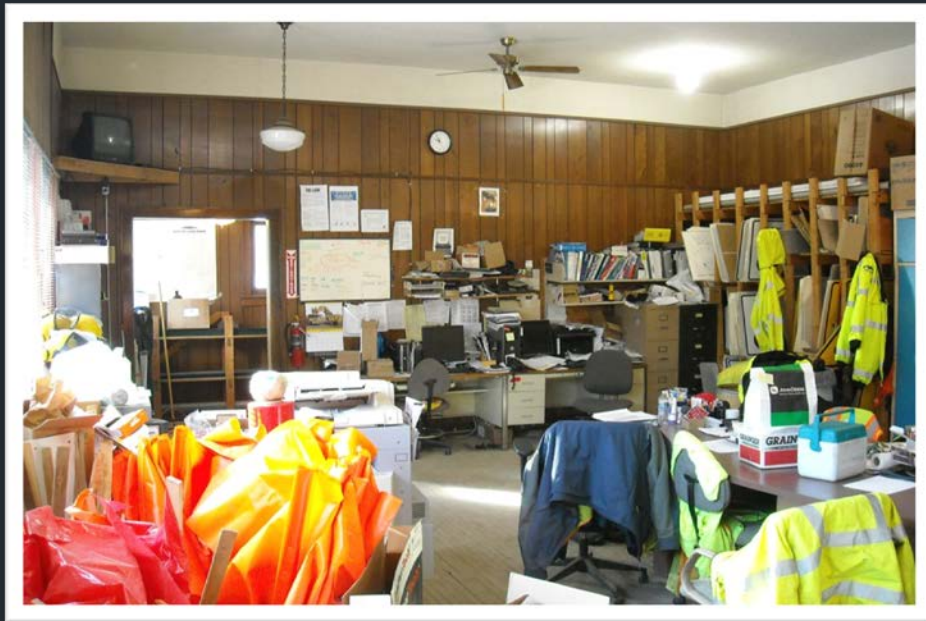
Office space, changing area signs and misc. storage are no longer all in one room.

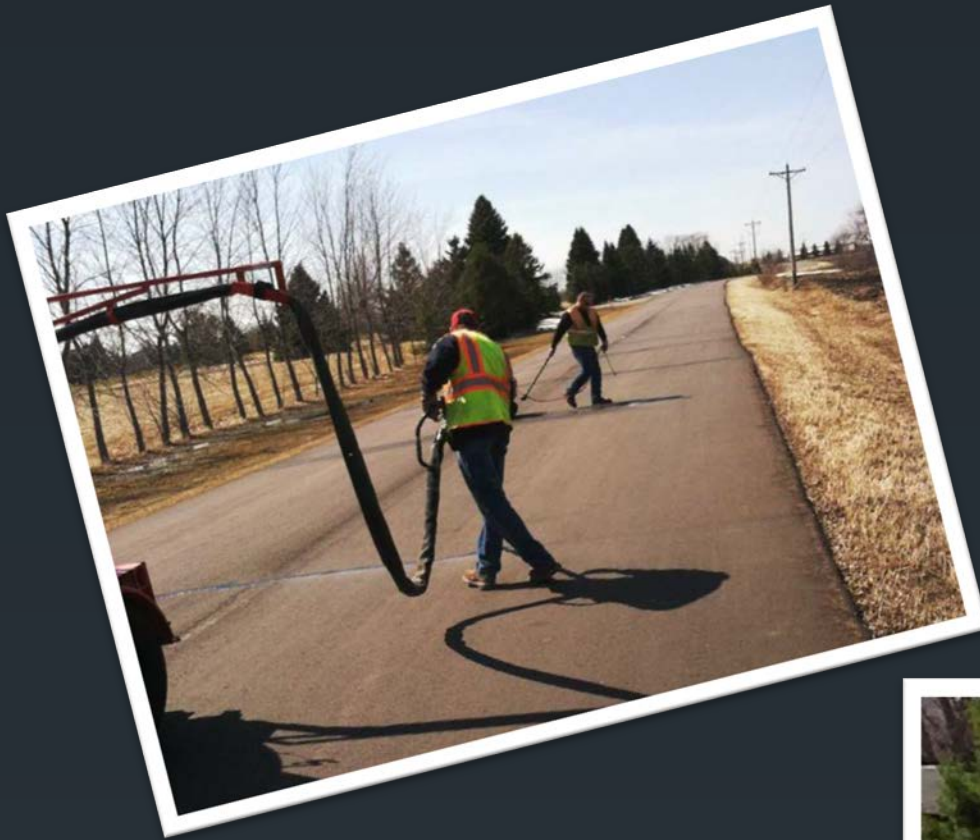


Public Work Department keeping the roads open using complex controls and monitors
