Glass Containers

YES Food and beverage bottles and jars

O Drinking glasses, ceramic dishes and vases Window glass and mirrors Light bulbs

Please empty containers and give them a good rinse. *Leave caps and lids on plastics.

Boxes & Paper

YES Mail, office and school papers
Magazines, catalogs, newspapers and
inserts
Phone books
Shredded paper in closed paper bags
Boxes
Paperboard (cereal, tissue boxes)

Paper soiled with food Paper plates and cups Paper napkins or towels Pizza delivery boxes Gift wrap
